


The RSVP Neighborhood Connection: Coming to a Location Near You!

Partner Spotlight: Metropolitan Library System



Heidi Port has served as the Volunteer Coordinator for Metropolitan Library System for 27 years and is passionate about her work and about volunteers.

"I fell into volunteer management as part of a job right out of college, and [...] I realized what I loved most was

ensuring people know they matter and are important, and that they have the opportunity to make a difference in their world. Working with staff and volunteers within the Metropolitan Library System and Friends of the Library is a perfect Venn diagram of those two things! I also delight in empowering our 70+ staff members who work directly with library volunteers to provide exceptional experiences and expand our community reach. I love my job and it's definitely my sweet spot!"

A couple months ago, Heidi contacted Jamie Williams, RSVP Volunteer Coordinator, to request a volunteer to help with office projects one day a week, and Pat Paugh began volunteering.

Pat Paugh, a military aircraft engine mechanic and U.S. Air Force Veteran, retired in 2008, and, while searching for "more," began volunteering with Habitat for Humanity in Phoenix, AZ, in 2009.

After moving to Oklahoma, Pat applied late last year to start volunteering through RSVP, and began volunteering for Metro Library in the Development & Volunteer Services Office, where she is helping maintain the Dolly Parton Imagination Library database.

Pat told us, "I have noticed that the members of the volunteer family move effortlessly to the beat of service... It doesn't hurt that RSVP employees show so much appreciation, kindness, and care. Metropolitan Library System has served Oklahoma County for over 120 years, and since the beginning, has strived to positively affect our communities. Metro's mission is "Connecting our diverse communities with resources and experiences to educate and enrich lives."

From providing essential services like onsite housing navigators and embedded DHS social workers to offering innovative opportunities such as 24/7 book kiosks and internship programs for Master of Social Work students, Metro Library is committed to meeting the evolving needs of patrons. In recent years, Metro Library has expanded its reach and impact through initiatives like the Dolly Parton Imagination Library, implemented in 2022, which continues to grow with over 14,000 participants.

Today, Metro Library features 100+ onsite libraries, notary services, community-wide strategic planning, and OKC Literacy partnerships, and has added over 70 new service partners this year alone. Whether through largescale programs or individual interactions at the circulation desk, Metro Library is committed to fostering a positive and inclusive environment for all, driving innovation and positively impacting the communities they proudly serve.
